TOO EASY

Never use passwords which are too simple : first names, "qwerty", "qwertz", "123456", "password", etc. These are all among the password banks tested with priority by hackers. Similarly, do not use the title of your account as a password.

MIX IT UP

Mix letters with numbers and special characters (! # \$% - _). Hackers test every word in the dictionary first!



KNOWN INFORMATION

Avoid using information that can be easily discovered: your residence, middle name, date of birth, etc. These passwords are easy to find for anyone you know or is connected with you on Facebook.

LONG PASSWORDS

Use long passwords - longer than 10 characters. The longer your password, the more difficult it is to crack. It is better to have a long password using letters than a short one with special characters.



PR

ALTERNATE LOWERCASE AND UPPERCASE

Alternate lowercase and uppercase letters, this adds complexity and strengthens the security level of your password.
